## U.S. News & World Report Ranks Sturgis #1 in MA

The U.S. News & World Report has just announced its 2012 rankings of the Best High Schools in the U.S., and Sturgis was ranked #1 in MA and #15 in the U.S.! The magazine uses a very complex formula to develop the rankings, one that includes student success on statewide testing (MCAS in MA), success on MCAS of students with special needs and high needs students in comparison to similar students at other schools in the state, and the participation and the achievement results of seniors on IB or AP exams. While Sturgis has received very high ranking on other lists in the past several years, this U.S. News ranking is the highest recognition that the school has achieved. We expect that the 2012 rankings of Newsweek and the Washington Post will also be announced in the coming weeks. As each organization that ranks schools uses different methodology to determine their rankings, it will be interesting to see where Sturgis is placed on the other two lists!

#### STUDENT EXCHANGE WITH HIGH SCHOOL IN SICILY

Twenty-nine students and two teachers from a high school in Piazza Armerina, Sicily will be visiting Sturgis West, plus touring Cape Cod and Boston historical sites, August 31 to September 9. While here, the students will be hosted by Sturgis West students and their families. In April 2013, during the Spring Break, the same Sturgis West students will travel to Sicily, to be hosted in return by the Sicilian students and their families. Students will visit the school there, plus go to Syracusa, Taormina, Agrigento, and Palermo, to see sites of historical interest in those cities.

Living with a host family--having a "brother" or "sister" in the host country, eating meals as a family, seeing real, everyday life--is what sets this program apart from other student exchanges. Wes Baden, a Sturgis West Latin teacher, conducted an exchange with the same high school in Sicily four years ago. He says that in many cases his students made friends with whom they still maintain contact and decided to study subjects such as Italian and Italian history at the college level.

#### 2012 WORLD CHALLENG TRIP TO ECUADOR

Sturgis East and Sturgis West are excited to announce that the summer of 2013, the World Challenge destination is Ecuador.

Ecuador is a country in South America, neighboring both Columbia and Peru. Although small, Ecuador is rich in cultural and diverse ecological habitats. It is home to exotic animals such as the giant tortoise, marine iguana, and numerous birds, including the famous Blue-footed booby.

This 15 day adventure will consist of four main parts, trekking one of numerous volcanoes, exploring the rainforest, working with locals on a community service project, and relaxing on one of island off the coast. This trip will push limits and expand minds. It is an adventure not to be missed.
